Applying the thought of Slavoj Zizek and other scholars to mainstream economic literature Bjerg provides a radical new way of looking at the mysterious stuff we use to buy things. It is a theory unfolded in reflections on the nature of monetary phenomena such as financial markets banks debt credit derivatives gold risk value price interests and arbitrage. The analysis of money is put into a historical context suggesting that the current financial turbulence and debt crisis are evidence that we live in the age of post-credit capitalism.
